Lower elementary is such an exciting time for students to embark on a new journey to learn how to read, write, perform fundamental operations, and do much more! I will work hard to ensure your child obtains the attention he or she deserves. Together with all the elementary teachers, I hope to make education fun for all and instill a love for learning.

This school year promises to be another productive partnership with you to ensure that your children will be able to achieve their highest potential. As partners, please share with me the responsibility for your child's success.

I ask that you guide and support your child's learning by ensuring that he/she:

- Attends school daily and arrives on time (8:30 am), ready for the day's learning experience
- Complete all homework assignments
- Reads daily to develop a love for reading and to improve vocabulary and comprehension
- Shares school experiences with you so that you are aware of his/her school life
- Lastly, but most importantly, know that you expect him/her to succeed in school

The following are other essential information as we start the school year.

8:30-11:30 Three-Hour Work Period (Morning Montessori Work Time)

11:30-12:00 Class Meeting/Whole Class Lesson Presentation

12:00-12:30 Lunch Time

12:30- 1:00 Play Time

1:00- 3:00 Afternoon Montessori Work Time

Snack

A daily snack time of 10 minutes is available for your child. Please send a small nutritious snack such as a granola bar, fruit, crackers, juice, etc. Please help us by reminding your child that he/she may not have chips for snacks. Please be advised that candy, gum, chocolates, nuts and soda are prohibited in school. Sharing of food is also discouraged. A microwave is not available during snack time.

Homework

Contrary to popular belief, Montessori children do have homework. Montessori education is continuous. Therefore, it is important that children have continued opportunities in their own homes to assume responsibility, accept the natural consequences, manage time, and choose activities wisely. Their homework packet is given every Friday so that you may plan and schedule your child's other activities. Please remember that children learn by doing. They need to participate actively in all areas of life and living. They are physically tough, gregarious, and quite capable of responsibility.

Lunch

For children who bring lunch from home, a microwave is available in the classroom to warm meals (not for cooking!). If you want your child to have instant noodles/macaroni and cheese for lunch, please cook it at home and place it in a microwavable safe container; we will be happy to assist your child to warm it up in school.

Laptop

Part of our technology implementation will include having the students use technology devices regularly throughout the school year. We highly encourage all the students to bring their laptops. Their laptops will be used as an academic learning tool only. No nonacademic games will be allowed at any time on the school campus.

Communication

Communication between the parent, child, and teacher is vital in education. However, there are better times to meet with the parents than just at the start or end of class. The office will be happy to arrange a mutually convenient appointment time. If there is an urgent need, I will be available from 8:00-8:30 am as I do my classroom preparation.
