## **Thematic Curriculum**

#### Session I (June 2-13): Reporting Live from Arborland!

What is journalism? What types of journalism exist? What do journalists do? What are current events? What is the structure of a written news article? What are the essential elements that make up a good news story? How do journalists decide which stories are newsworthy and worth reporting? What is broadcast journalism? What are the differences between news packages, video profiles, explainer videos, and short documentaries? How do journalists write for broadcast journalism? What is a pre-interview? Why do journalists conduct a pre-interview? What makes an interview successful? What are journalistic ethics? Students will unleash their creativity by crafting a captivating newsletter and go live with a public broadcast right from the heart of our Arborland community!

#### Session II (June 16-27): How Can I Be A Great Leader?

What is leadership? What makes a great leader? Who are great leaders in history and why? How do great leaders get results? Are there common traits among famous leaders? How can you tell if someone is/was a good leader? Do leaders have to overcome any challenges? Are there different types of leadership? What does leadership have to do with communication? Why is it important to be a leader? How can takeaways from social emotional learning help you improve as a leader? What are your strengths as a leader? How can you take what you learn and become an even better leader? Empower students to become community leaders and use their leadership skills to create impactful projects that give back to the community.

#### Session III (June 30-July 11): The Science of Agriculture

What is agricultural science? Why is agricultural science important? How does agricultural science impact the economy? What do agricultural scientists do? What scientific investigation skills are involved? How do they use the scientific method? What types of data do agricultural scientists collect? How does the environment impact agriculture? What plants grow where? Does the type of soil or the environment determine what can grow? What agricultural science experiments can be done with plants? What is cross breeding? How do scientists develop the "perfect" apple? What does GMO mean? Dive into the world of agricultural science with hands-on experiments!

Grow your own plants, test delicious food, and uncover the fascinating secrets of science and nature.

#### Session IV (July 14-August 1): New Product Innovation

How do you generate an idea for new product innovation? What are the steps to new product innovation? What problem do you see in your everyday life that a new product could solve? What problems do others see that a new product could solve? What target groups of people would use your product? How do you get feedback about your product to meet customer needs? What are current trends in the market for your product? How can AI help you do research on the industry? What makes your product unique or special compared to others? How would you explain the benefits of your product to others? How can you design your product? What materials would be best to build your product? How can you estimate how much building your product would cost? How will you decide how much your product is worth? How would you convince others to purchase your product? What is the best way to market your product? Where are the best places to sell your product (online, physical store, etc)? Unleash your creativity in new product development! Students will take a journey into the world of innovation, learning each step of the process and designing their own unique products. They'll develop prototypes using creative resources and present their innovative ideas. This hands-on experience is all about thinking outside the box and bringing brilliant concepts to life!
